- Consumers Helping Others Improve their Condition by Ending Smoking (CHOICES), a partnership of the Robert Wood Johnson Medical School's **Division of Addiction Psychiatry**, the Mental Health Association in New Jersey (MHANJ) and the state's Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS), received the first-place New Jersey Social Innovation Award for Community Voice Impact.
