We are proud to announce the first awardees of the RARC Pilot Grant Program designed to foster new collaborative, interdisciplinary addiction research among full-time faculty at Rutgers and to support pilot data that will lead to sustained funding from an external agency. Following external and internal reviews, each of the three MPI projects below will be awarded \$40,000 for a 1-year period and will be asked to share their results at next year's Annual RARC Fall Symposium.
