- RARC Chair of Epidemiology, Etiology & Prevention, **Dr. Tammy Chung,** discusses the challenges with accurately diagnosing cannabis use disorder and proposes a new model that addresses the critical need to improve how cannabis use disorder is diagnosed in individuals who use cannabis for therapeutic purposes.
