Rutgers News

• A recent study, published in the Journal of the American Academy of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry, led by **Drs. Mehvesh Khan and Emmanuel Sanchez** from **Robert Wood Johnson Medical School**,

showed an association between secondhand cannabis smoke exposure and an increase in externalizing symptoms and total psychopathological symptoms. The findings suggest that clinicians working with children should routinely inquire about secondhand cannabis exposure. For more information, <u>click here</u>.

- In a retrospective cohort study, researchers including **Molly Nowels, Hillary Samples, and and Stephen Crystal** from Rutgers University, aimed to examine the association of Medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD) after nonfatal opioid overdose with risk of repeat overdose in the following year. Findings showed that MOUD receipt was associated with reduced risk of repeat overdose. Those whose overdoses involved heroin or synthetic opioids were at higher risk of repeat overdose, but MOUD treatment was able to reduce that risk. For more information, <u>click here</u>.
- A new *Psychology Today* article highlights a recent report from the **Rutgers Institute for Nicotine** and **Tobacco Studies** that finds that flavored cigars are the second-most popular tobacco product among young people after e-cigarettes. For more information, <u>click here</u>.
